Author Guideline for the Paper Submission

Instructions for Authors

- LEARN2026 will follow a double-blind review process. All submitted papers will be evaluated based on quality,
 presentation, and relevance. In this process, the identities of authors are hidden from reviewers. Authors must
 maintain anonymity in their submissions while still providing sufficient context about related previous work,
 including their own.
- 2. Papers that do not follow double-blind submission guidelines will be rejected without review. Please read the anonymity guidelines given below.
- 3. Since the accepted and presented papers of LEARN2026 will be considered for publication in a suitable digital library or conference proceedings, authors must strictly follow the standard two-column format, and the manuscript must not exceed 6 pages.
- 4. Typesetting instructions and standard templates may be referred from widely accepted conference formatting styles.
- 5. The Camera Ready Copy (CRC) of every accepted paper will undergo a similarity check. Papers failing the similarity or compliance checks will be rejected.
- 6. Maximum length of camera-ready paper: 6 pages
- 7. Guidelines to Preserve Anonymity for Double-Blind Submissions
- 8. Remove author names and affiliations from the title page of the PDF submitted for review. This information must be added only in the final camera-ready version after acceptance.
- 9. Include author details only in the registration page during submission, not in the manuscript PDF.
- 10. Remove acknowledgments, identifying names, and funding sources from the review version. These should be added only in the final version.
- 11. Avoid including project names or titles that can reveal author identity via web search.
- 12. Name source files generically, avoiding identifiable filenames (e.g., avoid names like Ramesh.pdf).
- 13. When referring to your previous work, avoid self-identifying phrases. Instead of "Recently, we proposed...", use "Recently, the authors of [9] proposed...".
- 14. Do not upload papers with the same title/abstract to public platforms (e.g., preprint servers, mailing lists) before or during review.

Important Policy

- 1. Papers may be excluded from final proceedings if they are not presented at the conference.
- 2. Submitted papers should be original, unpublished, and not under review elsewhere (no double submission).
- 3. Papers must not contain plagiarized material.
- 4. Authors of accepted papers must complete the required copyright formalities and present the paper at the conference.
